SERMON SERIES on the FIVE SOLAS of the REFORMATION

The publishing by Martin Luther (1483–1546) of his 95 Theses on 31st Oct 1517 marked the start of the Reformation. As the Church commemorates the 500th anniversary, our current sermon series is on the *Five Solas*, that summarize the Reformers' theological convictions.

8th Oct Sola Scriptura ("Scripture alone"): The Bible alone is our highest authority.

15th Oct Solus Christus ("Christ alone"): Jesus Christ alone is our Lord, Saviour, and King.

29th Oct Sola Fide ("faith alone"): We are saved through faith alone in Jesus Christ.

5th Nov Sola Gratia ("grace alone"): We are saved by the grace of God alone.

19th Nov Soli Deo Gloria ("to the glory of God alone"): We live for the glory of God alone.

REMEMBRANCE SUNDAY– 12th November

During next Sunday's service, we will once again read out the names of all those listed on our two 1st World War memorials and observe the traditional two minutes' silence.

MAINTENANCE and CLEANING

The week before last a whole range of maintenance jobs were done on the inside of our premises. The painting of all the rails that surround our premises will soon be done. The total cost of this work is £2,200. All vinyl floors in the toilets and kitchen in the church centre have also recently been deep cleaned along with the carpets in the Charles Simeon and St Luke's room. Finally, we are grateful to the churchwardens and others who have done a lot of tidying up and cleaning inside our premises and cleared the trenches alongside the church.

A SERVICE of REMEMBRANCE @ FINCHLEY MEMORIAL HOSPITAL

This will be held at the War Memorial in the Reception area on Saturday (11th November) at 10.45am. This War Memorial commemorates men of Finchley and Whetstone who gave their lives in the Great War. The Revd David Walker, Vicar of Christ Church North Finchley, will conduct this short service. All are welcome. Refreshments will be served afterwards.

QUINQUENNIAL INSPECTION of OUR PREMISES

On Wednesday our architect will do the once-every-five years inspection of the church, church centre and grounds to see what condition they are in and what repairs are needed. The Diocese pays for the inspection on the church and we pay for the one on the centre.

THIS MONTH'S WORLD MISSION FOCUS: Revd David Nahayo

David is a priest of the Anglican Church of Rwanda, whose links with us go back to his time as a student at Oak Hill Theological College, some 30 years ago. He runs the Butare Christian Mission (BCM), which provides facilities for prayer groups and retreats and offers pastoral support. It also teaches skills such as sewing and crafts, gives goats, seeds and tools to help families support themselves and provides uniforms and books for children's schooling. In 2016 we gave £2,317 to support this work. For more details talk to Jan Appleyard.

ST PAUL'S CENTRE FOOD HYGIENE INSPECTION

On Wednesday 25th October we had an unannounced visit by the London Borough of Barnet Food Hygiene/Food Standards/Health & Safety Inspector. The officer assessed:

- how hygienically food is handled;
- the condition of the structure of the buildings; and
- how we manage what we do to make sure food is safe.

We received a 5* rating, the highest possible, which means we were seen as very good.

BARNABAS in SCHOOLS in ST MARY'S CE PRIMARY SCHOOL

Tomorrow John Hardwick of *Barnabas in Schools* is running a creative arts-based RE Day in our church primary school entitled: *Creating Character: Respect, Resilience and Responsibility*. This will offer a range of ways for the 120 pupils in Years 3 and 4 (7-9 year olds) to engage with the important values of respect, resilience and responsibility. Focusing on stories from the Bible, the day will cover: what are values and character? How do they form the people we are and the communities we belong to? How do values relate to school life both individually and corporately? John will also lead a whole school act of worship on this theme.

REMEMBERING THOSE WHO DIED in the FIRST WORLD WAR

We mark the 100th anniversary of the death of the people listed on our war memorials:

Corporate Leslie **ADAMS**, aged 23, 28th Battalion, London Regiment (1st Artists' Rifles) (died 30/10/1917). Leslie was born in Holloway, north London, and was an only child. In 1901 he was living with his parents in Kentish Town and then in 1911 in Stockwell, south London. He was killed in action in the Third Battle of Ypres. His name is listed on the Tyne Cot Memorial, one of four memorials to the missing in Belgian Flanders which cover the area known as the Ypres Salient. His estate was valued at £161 17s 11d, which he left to his father. His connection to Finchley is unknown.

Driver Aylmer **CHURCHMAN**, Army Service Corps, 74th Division. (died 04/11/1917). Aylmer was born in Swaffham, Norfolk, and had four siblings. He married Florence Kimble in 1901 at Bromley, Kent. They had two sons and in 1911 were living in Brockley, south-east London. He was employed as a domestic coachman. He enlisted in Finchley in late 1915, giving his address as 66 Elm Park Road, Finchley. He served in France and Salonika, before being deployed to Egypt. After recovering from malaria, he took part in the Third Battle of Gaza and was killed in action. He is buried in Beersheba War Cemetery, Israel.
