## Introduction

We meet in the presence of God – Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

We have gathered here today to remember with thanksgiving and sorrow those whose lives, in world wars and conflicts past and present, have been given and taken away.

We remember, in particular, those from Finchley and from this church who were caught up in the courageous but tragic events of the First World War – those who were killed in action, or by wounds and disease, the bereaved, the lost, the families which were shattered, the maimed and injured, those who held in silence unspeakable memories of warfare.

As we remember those who fought and those who remained anxiously at home, we pray for all who in bereavement, disability and pain continue to suffer the consequences of fighting and terror and we commit ourselves to work for reconciliation between the nations, that all people may, together, live in freedom, justice and peace.
